What are the CAPS Outreach Center Programs?

Come be a part of an academic program that truly makes a difference! Every year, the CAPS Outreach Center's Upward Bound Projects host college-bound high school students during the summer. Our projects include Academic Enrichment Upward Bound, Pre-College Upward Bound, and Math Science Upward Bound. Our participants are traditionally low-income, first generation students. Participants are highly motivated to succeed in high school and beyond. Our job is to help kindle a cando spirit and provide experiences that participants may not have an opportunity to experience in their high school environment.

What is the residential instruction component of the summer program?

Our students live on UT's campus during a four-week residential component. Resident assistants are leaders and role models for these students. RAs, in addition to dorm responsibilities, will participate and lead students through cultural, academic, and social activities. Resident assistants **must live in the dorms** with the students and must attend one week of paid in-service training and commuter week prior to the program. In addition to their pay, RAs receive a room and weekly meals during the four-week residential program.

JOB DESCRIPTION: Live-In Residential/Dorm Counselor

DATES: June 6, 8 – Non-Residential: In-service Training

June 7, 9, 19 – Non-Residential: Work with Students

June 12- July 15 Residential Component

FUNCTION: To be responsible for students and their out-of-the classroom activities; to serve as counselors and supervisors for students as needed; to help students make the transition and necessary adjustments to living away from home for the first time and learning to get along with others; to serve students in such a way as to contribute to a successful residential campus experience.

DESCRIPTION OF RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. To supervise and coordinate physical and recreational activities for students.
- 2. To supervise students during meals (breakfast, lunch, and supper).
- 3. To supervise and coordinate evening activities for students.
- 4. To do hall checks at night.
- 5. To provide assistance with transportation via supervising bus pick-up/drop-off and/or driving University vehicles such as a minivan, 12-passenger van, and/or SUV.
- 6. To complete and submit paperwork on time as outlined by the Project Director.
- 7. To participate in all in-service activities and staff meetings as determined by the Project Director.
- 8. To perform any other program activities deemed necessary by the Project Director.
- 9. To always display professionalism and appropriate behavior.
- 10. To be available one day a week for on-call duty and to respond to student emergencies.
- 11. To adhere to all's policies and regulations. Upward Bound and The University of Tennessee
- 12. To maintain a comfortable, caring, and supportive atmosphere for the students.
- 13. To serve as a mediator for students as necessary.
- 14. To enforce disciplinary action, if necessary, as outlined by the Project Director
- 15. To advise and counsel students as necessary and appropriate.
- 16. To make appropriate referrals when deemed necessary.
- 17. To maintain open lines of communication with other residential counselors, other Program staff members, students, and all University of Tennessee employees.
- 18. To maintain positive public relations with all students, parents, Program staff and with all The University of Tennessee employees.
- 19. To participate in the evaluation of program services.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Sophomore undergraduate student at a local college/university.
- Must demonstrate the ability to communicate and work effectively with high school students.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Junior/Senior Undergraduate or Graduate student with residence halls and/or program experience
- Areas of study include but are not limited to psychology, social work, counseling, or other related areas.

PAY RANGE: starts at \$10.00 per hour, depending on experience and qualifications (6 weeks x 40 hours per week); PLUS all room, meal, and activities costs are provided by the Upward Bound program.
